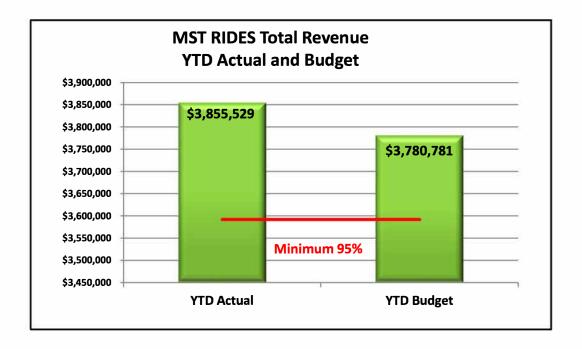


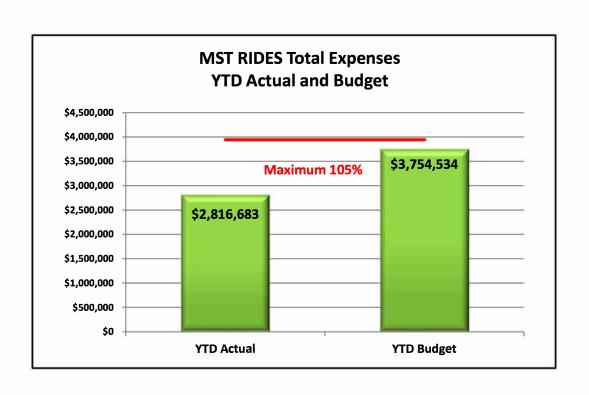
MST Fixed Route Financial Performance Comparative Statistics July - January Fiscal Year 2022

FIXED ROUTE BUS OPERATIONS:

System-Wide Service: (Fixed Route & On-Call Services):

MST's preliminary boarding statistics indicate ridership was 121,891 in January 2022, which represents a 42.75% increase compared to January 2021's ridership of 85,388. For the fiscal year to date, passenger boardings continue to increase overall; however, this positive ridership trend could change as we continue our recovery efforts.

Month over month, MST's productivity continues to improve. MST's productivity increased from 5.2 passengers per hour in January 2021, to 8.0 passengers per hour in January of this year. This represents a 52.5% improvement compared to the same month, year over year.

On-Time Performance (OTP): Of 84,439 total time-point crossings sampled for January, the Transit Master™ system recorded 9,838 delayed arrivals to MST's published time-points system-wide. As a result, 89% of all scheduled arrivals arrived on time. (See MST Fixed-Route Bus ~~ On Time Compliance Chart FY 2021 - 2022.)

Note: Service arriving later than **5** minutes beyond the published time point is considered late. The on-time compliance chart, (attached), reflects system-wide "on-time performance" as a percentage of the total number of reported time-point crossings.

Service Canceled: As listed below, there were a total of fourteen (14) service cancellations in January for both directly operated and contracted services. This was a significant increase of ten (10) compared to the previous month, November 2022. This increase is directly attributed to staffing shortages at both MST and MV:

CONTRACTED TRANSPORTATION SERVICES:

MST RIDES ADA / MST Paratransit Program:

Preliminary boarding statistics for the MST RIDES program reflect that for January 2022 there were 7,473 passenger boardings. This is a 24% increase in passenger boardings compared to January of 2021, (6,043). For the fiscal year, passenger boardings have increased by 25% compared to FY 2021.

- Productivity for January 2022 was 1.55 passengers per hour, increasing from 1.51 passengers per hour compared to the previous month (December 2021).
- For January 2022, 90% of all scheduled trips for the MST RIDES program arrived on time, meeting the expected on-time performance standard.

Systemwide Service:

Boardings reported for the month of January show ridership to be 42.7% higher than in January of 2021, when 85,388 boardings were reported. Over that same timeframe, the amount of revenue hours operated decreased by 6.4%, resulting in a 52.5% increase in productivity, from 5.2 Passengers Per Hour last January to 8.0 Passengers Per Hour this January. The increase in ridership can be attributed to fewer emergency service reductions and fewer county wide restrictions due to COVID-19. Line 23X-Salinas/King City Express began operating on December 11, 2021 with 4 daily trips and reported 472 boardings.

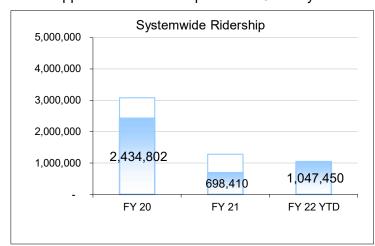
For the fiscal year (July-January) ridership has increased 50.0% and revenue hours operated have increased 6.3%, resulting in a 41.1% increase in productivity (from 6.2 PPH to 8.8 PPH).

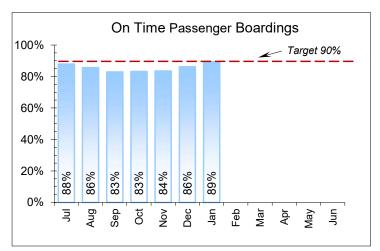

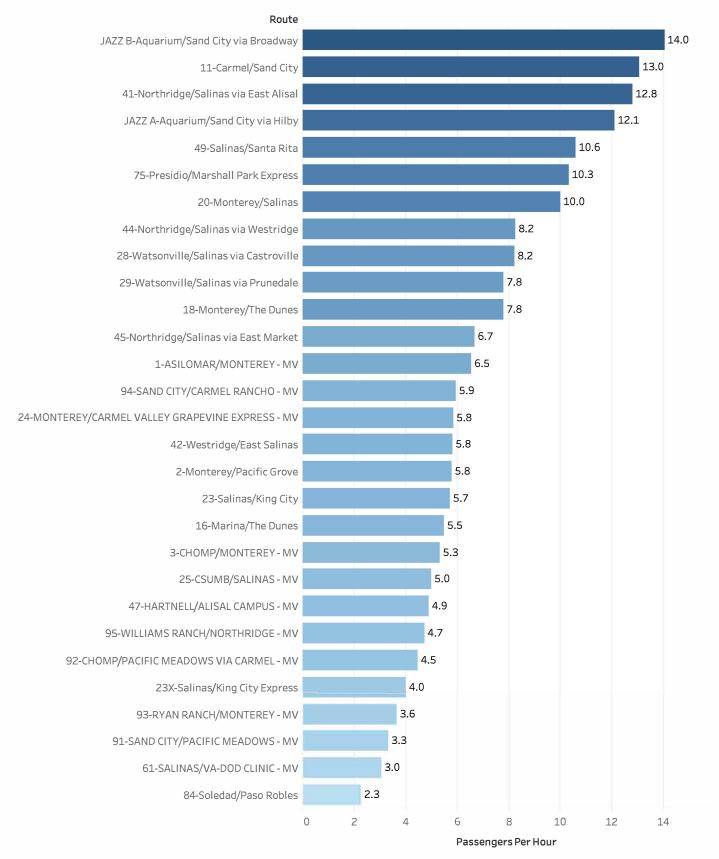




Ridership by Line

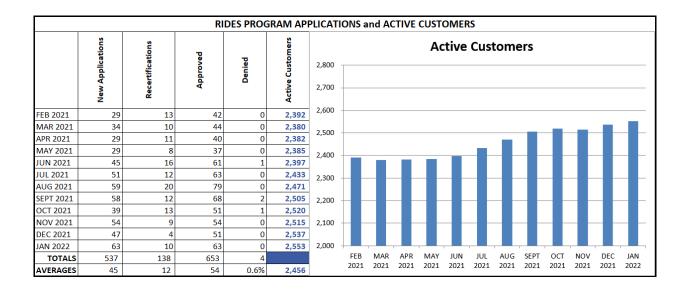

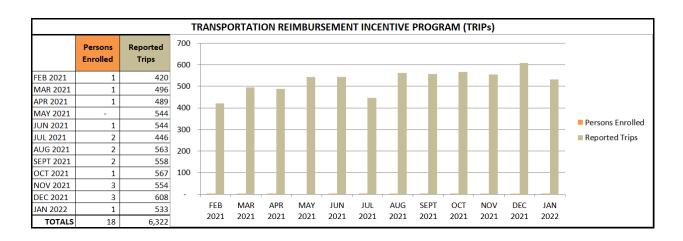

This report summarizes the performance and major activities of the Maintenance Department as well as fuel and operating expenses during the month.

Department Activities/Comments:

January 2022's cost per gallon for gasoline decreased by .17 cents and the cost per gallon for diesel increased by .22 cents compared to the previous month of December 2021. Fuel prices continue to fluctuate.

In January 2022, MST traveled 22,210 miles between major mechanical failures – exceeding the 15,000-mile goal. MST has continued to meet or exceed the stated goal within this area of performance.

It should be noted that MST has dramatically reduced the overall number of revenue miles traveled to conform with current ridership demands and other factors resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. As MST continues to increase service, a corresponding

increase in the number of miles traveled between major mechanical failures is expected.

MST's operating cost per mile for January 2022, increased to \$1.15 per mile from \$1.10 per mile in December 2021. Staff continues to focus their efforts on cleaning, disinfecting, repairing, and maintaining all MST vehicles. MST's Maintenance Management team continues working closely with Human Resources to recruit for several open positions within the Maintenance department to fill current vacancies that have had a slight negative impact on Maintenance operations.

In January, staff met with Chargepoint, Inc. to discuss installation options for up to three (3) Chargepoint chargers at the Salinas Operations and Maintenance Facility. Currently, MST has two (2) Gillig BEBs that operate out of the Monterey Bay Operations and Maintenance Facility. These BEBs can only be charged with Chargepoint, Inc.'s proprietary infrastructure. As a result, the operating area is restricted to deployment from the Monterey Peninsula. This new infrastructure in Salinas will improve MST's ability to charge battery-electric buses (BEB) throughout Monterey County and may improve the operating range for MST's BEBs.

Contactless Tap to Pay:

During the month of January, MST received a total of 7,267 taps, an increase of 23.4% from December. There were 3,069 successful journeys where the passenger tapped on when they boarded and again when they got off. There were 1,129 penalty taps where the customer only tapped on and did not tap off, resulting in a \$3.50 penalty fare being assessed.

Since launching the demonstration project on May 11, 2021 there have been a total of 47,358 taps, of which 20,142 trips were successful. Total revenue collected to the end of January from passengers using contactless payments was \$66,708. The numbers are steadily increasing and as passengers become accustomed to using the new technology, this will be their preferred method of payment.

Finance Update

General Accounting/Accounts Payable

During the month of January, staff processed timely and accurate payments to vendors, recorded appropriate revenues, and prepared monthly financial reporting and analysis. During the month of January, staff prepared and distributed the IRS-required W-2s and 1099 forms as well as compiled and submitted the California State Controllers 2020-21 Transit Operators Financial Transactions Report.

Payroll

Payroll created multiple new federal and state tax tables to conform with changes in tax rates effective January 1, 2022. A reconciliation of all quarterly returns filed for 2021 was completed to close the year and to generate W-2s for all active and terminated employees by the January 31, 2022, deadline. Routine changes and adjustments to payroll records were maintained along with filing of all federal, state, and retirement reports and payments on a timely basis

Grants

During the month of January, staff drafted, followed up on, responded to, and submitted pending applications, requests for reimbursement, and program reporting under the 5307 Traditional, 5307 CRRSAA, LCFS, LCTOP, 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities, TIFIA programs, 5307 ARP Act, and Clean California Grant Programs. In addition to attending several webinars for future grant opportunities, staff also participated in webinars regarding the Transit and Intercity Rail Capital Program, Active Transportation Program, and Clean California Local Grant Program. Staff also participated in several meetings regarding current and future projects including the SURF! Busway and BRT, bus procurements, shelter replacements, the South County Operations and Maintenance Facility, and the Fort Ord Building Removal Project. Update meetings with internal staff were ongoing to address status changes to various active or pending grants and requests for reimbursements. Staff also submitted an application to the Clean California Local Grant Program and participated in the Caltrans working group for the new Caltrans Consolidated Grant application which is scheduled to kick off in April of 2022 and will be used for the 5311, 5311(f), 5339, and LCTOP programs. During the month of January staff also received an award from the FTA's Transit Oriented Design Planning Program.

Procurements and Purchasing

At the beginning of the month, the Procurement and Contracts Manager left MST, leaving the position vacant. During the rest of the month, procurement efforts were focused on assisting with a Request for Proposals evaluation for contracted transportation services and finalizing the contract with Kimley-Horn for final design for the SURF! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit project. Staff also attended meetings for the implementation of the new Tangicloud accounting system to replace the existing system. Staff supported contract management efforts for janitorial services and supported efforts to procure charging equipment/stations at the Salinas Operations and Maintenance Facility site.

Information Technology Update

Administrative Technology:

• **Tangicloud:** The Tangicloud migration continues as planned. User Acceptance Testing (UAT) has begun, with weekly training sessions in preparation for deployment in a late March or early April timeframe.

Operations Technology:

- 3G Cellular Service: Most U.S. Cellular carriers are in the process of beginning
 to phase out 3G cellular transmissions, beginning in March of 2021. This will
 have an impact on some of our legacy systems and a review is currently being
 conducted with our providers to establish what may need to be upgraded to, at
 minimum, 4G service.
- Leads times on various operations technology items: As noted in the
 December update, I.T. is continuing to see long-lead times, limited availability,
 and higher costs associated with replacing failed or obsolete electronic
 equipment (i.e. the "chip" shortage). We are continuing to monitor the situation
 and adjust as necessary.
- TransitMaster: After discussions with the provider of TransitMaster, I.T., in
 conjunction with Operations, is looking into the feasibility of moving to the most
 current stable release of their product during the planned upgrade process. This
 will bring our software up to a version that is more current than our original
 upgrade plans had called for, however it should improve support and the
 availability of security and stability updates.
- Contactless Fare System: After observing an increase in failures of the
 contactless fare units, Operations made some adjustments in their cleaning and
 maintenance of the systems, which appears to have mitigated this issue. Like
 many other electronic systems however, repair and replacement turnaround has
 continued to take longer than expected due to the chip shortages. Currently
 MST has sufficient units to continue our evaluation but we are monitoring the
 situations as well as looking at ways to perform more in-house repairs.

Cybersecurity:

The White House Officer of Management and Budget on January 26th
announced a directive to move all federal agencies to a Zero Trust Architecture
cybersecurity model. While this directive is not yet mandated outside of federal
agencies, the expectation is as this security approach begins to be widely
deployed within those government groups, state and local agencies will find

themselves having to comply as well. As such, I.T. will begin to include this in future systems planning.

 January Advisories: Overall, the MS-ISAC (Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center) issued approximately 15 cybersecurity advisories in January of 2022 that were considered potentially critical to Public Agencies.

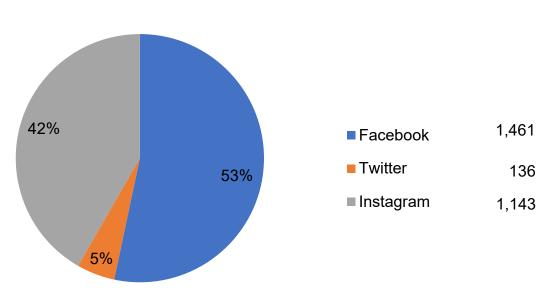

Planning Update

Staff met with CSUMB, MPC and Hartnell to begin developing the 2022-2023 College Pass Program. The current college contracts expire in spring and summer 2022. Ongoing meetings will take place in the coming months to develop a consistent program across all three colleges.

MST Staff is continuing to work with the four South County Cities to implement new bus stops and establish fixed route circulator service. Currently, each of the four cities – Gonzales, Greenfield, Soledad, and King City – are working to return cost estimates for the work to MST. Once MST receives those cost estimates, staff will begin negotiation with the cities on contracts for work and any permitting that may be necessary.

Staff is evaluating the next steps for completing the Automatic Passenger Counters (APCs) implementation. The APCs are still currently not yielding an adequate amount of data that is usable per NTD's standards. Staff is preparing for the triennial NTD survey to recertify the APCs to be used in reporting measures this year.

Staff has generated and is maintaining a comprehensive bus stop database to track work orders and all bus stops and amenities within MST's network. Several bus stops

became temporarily inactive because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Staff has been compiling information from various sources to generate an up-to-date bus stop list to be used for better record-keeping.

Throughout the month, staff continued participating in meetings with various local agencies, including the Transportation Agency for Monterey County, Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments, and Blue Zones Built Environment Committee.



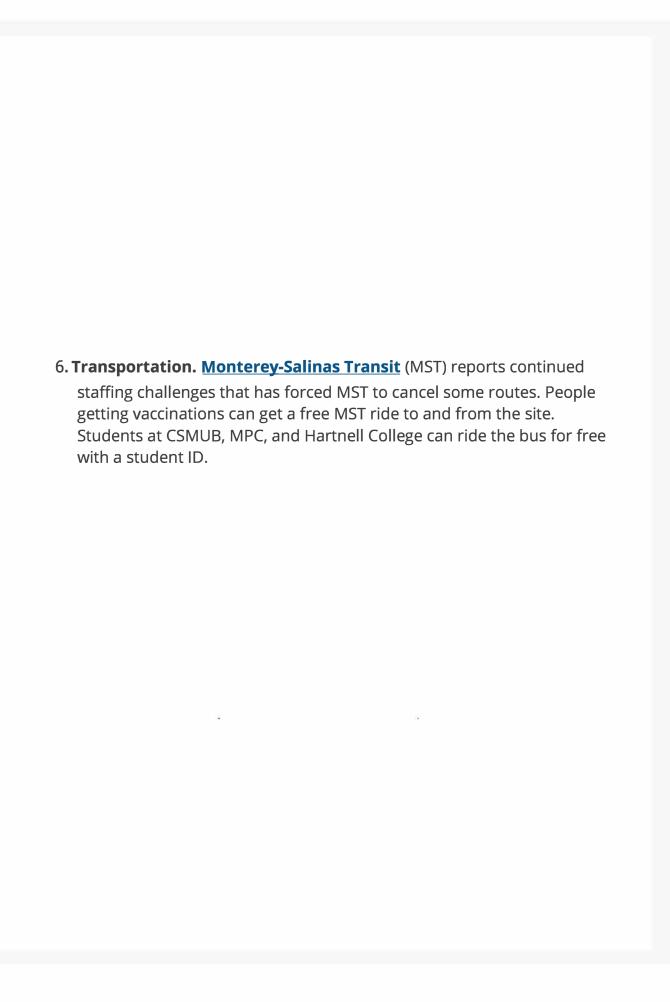

Seaside City Council agrees to purchase Broadway lot for parking

The Seaside City Council voted to purchase a lot on Broadway Avenue at Del Monte Boulevard for \$1,093,000 to provide parking for the West Broadway Urban Village in the short term and to help complete the long-term vision for the area

"We're having plenty of parking issues all over the city and we believe this is going to solve some of our issues down in the Broadway areas and also has some other long-term positive consequences," said acting City Manager Roberta Greathouse during the Jan. 6 meeting.

The property, located at 490 Broadway Ave. and 1590 Del Monte Blvd. is primarily paved asphalt and includes a small office. According to the staff report, the property was formerly used as an automobile sales yard and it has been underutilized since the business there closed. The property is near a commercial building on Del Monte that includes an insurance office and a tailoring business.

"This is something that goes along with our West Broadway Urban Village concept and that's something we've been talking about for, I don't know, maybe a decade," Mayor Ian Oglesby said during the meeting. "To be able to get this parcel is important for future councils to be able to move and be flexible and put in the things that the city needs."

The city signed a lease agreement for the property on Sept. 20 to use it as overflow parking for a jazz festival. During that time, the city agreed to pursue purchasing the property for \$1 million to \$1.2 million pending appraisal. The land was appraised at the \$1,093,000 figure.

"Councilman Alexis (Garcia-Arrazola) and myself spoke to numerous businesses down there that were supportive of it," Mayor Pro Tem Dave Pacheco said. "We spoke to two businesses this week and they reiterated the fact that parking has been a problem. They've had increased business but parking remains a problem."

Pacheco suggested the city create a sign to indicate to drivers that the lot is free city-owned parking since it used to be private property used as a car lot.

The city's plans for the area call for turning part of Contra Costa Street behind the parking into a plaza. Across Del Monte Boulevard, there are plans to create a Monterey-Salinas Transit center.

"This plaza and this property could be an integral component of making that future plan possible," said Assistant City Manager Trevin Barber.

Pastor Ronald Britt spoke in support of the purchase during public comment.

"Parking on Broadway at this time is very limited," he said. "Even when I try to come out to go to the place where the city houses people there is very difficult parking there. So I ask that this council adopt this resolution tonight. It will make it better for the businesses on Broadway."

Before the vote, Councilman Jason Campbell asked if there is a water meter connected to the property.

"This parcel does have a Level 1 meter associated with the office use," Barber said.

Monterey-Salinas Transit receives federal grant to study busway, bus rapid transit

MARINA — The Federal Transit Administration recently announced it sent a \$405,000 grant to Monterey-Salinas Transit to fund transit-oriented development studies along its Surf! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit Project between Marina and Sand City.

The Monterey-Salinas Transit board approved the proposed Surf! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit Project, a bus-only lane next to Highway 1 between Marina and Sand City, in July 2021. The federal grant funding provided was allocated through the Federal Transit Administration's pilot program for Transit-Oriented Development Planning.

"This specific grant is to help the cities that will be served by the routes that operate on the Surf! Busway and (Bus Rapid Transit) to develop what is known as transit-oriented development policies and programs to support increased use of transit, pedestrian, bike and other alternatives to single-occupancy vehicles," Monterey-Salinas Transit CEO Carl Sedoryk told The Herald Tuesday. "So everything from various ordinances for parking, to land-use policies for higher-density affordable workforce housing in and around transit stations, this grant will be used to help these cities identify strategies that they might be missing."

Sedoryk said the transit agency is preparing to embark on the final design stages of the project and start a public outreach process within the communities that will be served by the project over the next year.

"One of the most persistent rumors that I hear is that this is somehow a bus line that only goes from Sand City to Marina and the buses turn around and it's not that," Sedoryk said. "What it is is a busway that all of our MST routes that are currently on Highway 1, and there are many of them, will be able to use to bypass traffic whether the route is stopping in Sand City or continuing on all the way to Monterey."

Sedoryk said the Line 20 bus that goes from Salinas to Monterey, the busiest line for the agency, will benefit along with the other bus lines that traverse Highway 1 between Marina and Sand City. He said the project will also benefit the lines that use the bus rapid transit portion of the project while also decreasing traffic for those driving in their own vehicles.

"The bus rapid transit portion is coordinated signals — traffic signal prioritization where the buses might get a little jump on traffic like we currently have at Aguajito

Sedoryk said the policies funded by the grant are an important step in moving the project forward and will help in making the project work best for the people it will serve.

"Having those policies under development is important to our federal funding partners and they would like to see that in place before they provide us with a grant to actually start construction," he said. "As we will be depending on federal funds to cobble together the funding for this project, having this grant in place helps check that box that makes us more likely to be funded."

After the Monterey-Salinas Transit board approved the Surf! Busway and Bus Rapid Transit Project last year, the transit agency is now working on how the project will be funded, tapping various state and federal programs.

In a press release, Rep. Jimmy Panetta (D-Carmel Valley) said the investment will help reduce Central Coast commute times and carbon output, which will improve the environment.

"Traffic, congestion, and vehicle emissions have increased substantially along Highway 1 between Marina and Sand City," Panetta said. "Fortunately, the MST Busway and Bus Rapid Transit Project will help mitigate those issues with its busonly lanes. I'm proud to announce that the federal government is playing its part by providing a significant amount of federal funding to ensure the success of local transit projects."

The project is still in the early stages, Sedoryk said, but he's looking forward to seeing the end results in coming years.

"If that 20 (bus line) can go faster than traffic during commute hours, that in and of itself will drive more people to ride the bus when they see it passing them by," he said. "This project will allow that to happen."
