Subject: Monthly Report – November/December 2016

Attached is a summary of monthly performance statistics for the Transportation, Maintenance, and Administration departments for November / December 2016 (Attachments 1-5). Overall performance results still fall within acceptable standards year to date. However, staff is monitoring a recent increase in the frequency of preventable accidents since July 2016. While the severity of the accidents have been mostly minor in nature the MST safety committee comprised of coach operators, maintenance and administrative professionals is reviewing the data to recommend specific actions to reverse this trend.

November 16 - 19 I attended the California Transit Association Annual Conference and Product Showcase in Oakland, CA. At the conference I attended a meeting of the association executive committee, a variety of workshops and participated on a panel focusing on federal, state and local election results and their impact on transit.

November 30 - December 2, I traveled to Washington DC to attend meetings of the American Public Transit Association Board of Directors and participated in National Center for Mobility Management peer exchange which focused on how transit agencies are working with new technologies, Transportation Network Companies and other mobility service providers to move customers. 

MST Fixed Route YTD Dashboard Performance Comparative Statistics Months of July - December Fiscal Years 2015-2017




MST Fixed Route YTD Dashboard Performance Comparative Statistics Months of July - December Fiscal Years 2015-2017





YTD Dashboard Performance Comparative Statistics Months of July - December Fiscal Years 2015-2017






YTD Dashboard Performance Comparative Statistics Months of July - December Fiscal Years 2015-2017


Financial Performance Comparative Statistics July - December Fiscal Year 2017



FIXED ROUTE BUS OPERATIONS:

System Wide Service: (Fixed Route & On Call Services):

Preliminary boarding statistics indicate that ridership increased by 2.92% in November 2016, (338,846), as compared to November 2015, (329,224). Fiscal year to date – passenger boardings have increased by 2.60% as compared to the same period last year.

Productivity increased slightly from November of last year (14.9) to 15.1 passengers per hour for November of this year.

Supplemental / Special Services:

November 27: MST provided supplemental services during the annual Salinas Holiday Parade of lights transporting 85 passengers – increasing from 21 passengers transported during last year's event.

Time Point Adherence: Of 125,812 total time-point crossings sampled for the month of November, the TransitMaster™ system recorded 18,121 delayed arrivals to MST's published time-points system-wide. MST RIDES ADA / ST Paratransit Program:

Preliminary boarding statistics for the MST RIDES program reflect that for the month of November there were 10,202 passenger boardings. This denotes a 11.30% increase in passenger boardings from November of 2015, (9,166). Fiscal year to date – passenger boardings have increased by 5.53% as compared to the same period last year.

- Productivity for November of this year was at 1.80 passengers per hour, remaining unchanged from November of 2015, (1.80).




MONTEREY TROLLEY MONTHLY RIDERSHIP











Ridership by Line - November 2016 Passenger Boardings






Ridership by Line - December 2016 Passenger Boardings




Productivity by Line - December 2016 Passengers Per Hour

Mobility Department Update - November 2016

Outreach and Training

Mobility Specialists met with the *Senior Kings and Queens* in King City to introduce MST Mobility services to that community and to discuss the upcoming Volunteer Driver Mileage Reimbursement program planned for FY18.

Veterans Helping Veterans Program

Mobility Specialists participated in a ceremony honoring 12 veteran volunteers for their community service. The event was sponsored by the United Veterans Council. Each veteran was awarded one year of free MST bus passes.

Taxi Voucher Programs

Mobility Specialist began training program staff in cities participating in the MST Senior Taxi Voucher Program to enroll new seniors in the program and to access the Mobility Activities Reporting System (MARS) to track voucher distribution and usage within their city.

Taxi ADA Certification Training (TACT)

Following the November TACT training, a total of 55 taxi drivers have now completed the TACT training and are certified to provide MST RIDES trips and to accept MST taxi vouchers.

RIDES Program

As of November 2016, there were 2,419 customers enrolled in the RIDES program, up 10% from November 2015. Of these, 688 customers took trips during the month totaling 8,800 trips of which 32% required wheelchair access. The *no show* was 8.9% and the *late cancellation* rate was 13.0%.




Miles Between Major Mechanical Roadcalls FY16 vs. FY17 YTD

Year to Date Comparison









PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE (PMs) INSPECTIONS PAST TWELVE MONTHS









Finance Update - November 2016

General Accounting/Accounts Payable

During the month of November, staff processed timely and accurate payments to vendors, recorded appropriate revenues, and prepared monthly financial reporting and analysis. In addition, staff completed and submitted the required annual reporting to the National Transit Database which aids in the appropriation of FTA formula funds to transit agencies.

<u>Payroll</u>

Routine changes and adjustments to payroll records were maintained along with filing of all federal, state, and retirement reports and payments on a timely basis. Payroll continued to provide hours and earnings reports upon request to MST departments

Grants

Staff prepared for and participated in a site visit from Caltrans. It was a comprehensive review of program expenses for Prop 1B Public Transportation Modernization Improvement and Service Enhancement Account (PTMISEA). The Grants Analyst assisted with compiling information for the National Transit Database annual report.

The Low Carbon Transit Operations Program progress report was prepared and submitted on time.

Purchasing

During the month of November, Parts Staff was busy with managing inventory levels, and ensuring continued supplies. Inventory levels are remaining under \$200K and with the new buses added to the fleet. Parts staff is seeing a decline in the expenditure of costly component replacements. Parts staff has also been evaluating and disposing of obsolete inventory in preparation for the future relocation of Parts inventory and staff, to a temporary location during construction at TDA.

Information Technology Update- November 2016

Staff worked with MST Operations and Maintenance Department personnel for the monitoring of the ITS equipment installed on the vehicles. These include the hardware and software for the Trapeze Group Automatic Vehicle Location system on the fixed route and Paratransit fleets.

Staff liaised with Trapeze Software Group to start the process for implementation of the Fixed Route Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system. Staff purchased and configured the necessary hardware for this system.

Staff monitored and tweaked the Trapeze Group Enterprise Asset Management (EAM) vehicle maintenance system.

Staff continued to support the users of the Serenic Navision accounting/payroll system.

Staff monitored the functionality of the customer service database.

Staff worked with Giro and MST staff in preparing for the next phase of the implementation of the new modules in the Hastus system.

Staff liaised with the County of Monterey Information Technology Department and Trapeze Group regarding the radio hardware to be installed to extend data/radio/cell coverage to include San Jose and other outlying areas of service.

Staff monitored the virtual computer systems.

Staff monitored and tweaked the AT&T managed Voice Over IP (VOIP) telephone system.

Staff continued to support other MST staff members as needed, proactively ensuring that all were supported fully with their IT needs.

Staff attended the CTA Conference in Oakland.

Planning Update - November 2016

During the month of November, staff continued to monitor the revenues and expenses for the military partnerships after implementation of the July 2014 Presidio reductions that were required because Congress allowed the expanded federal transit benefit to be reduced by nearly 50% effective December 2013. Revenues received from the federal transit benefit have stabilized and increased during recent months so that revenues are matching expenses and have fully made up for previous losses. During the month the Presidio, with assistance of MST Business Development Transit Planner, Mike Gallant, continued its targeted recruitment efforts to maximize military and civilian participation in the federal transit benefit program. This effort is intended to stabilize and grow revenues for MST to continue operating the military-funded routes. Fortunately, Congress voted in December 2015 to raise the transit benefit again on a permanent basis. The benefit was raised for the Presidio participants on March 10, 2016. As such, staff will continue discussions with the Presidio to re-evaluate the program with some expansions possible for the future.

In November, staff held a kick-off meeting with agency partners on the Bus Operations on Highway 1 Shoulders and the Monterey Branch Line Feasibility Study. In attendance were representatives from Caltrans, California Highway Patrol, AMBAG, TAMC, Santa Cruz METRO, Santa Cruz Regional Transportation Commission, City of Marina, and the consultant team, CDM Smith.

Staff met with City of Gonzales staff to evaluate the possibility of installing bus stops in the downtown area to better serve the City and MST passengers.

Throughout the month, staff continued participating in meetings with various local agencies, including the Transportation Agency for Monterey County, Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments, Salinas Valley Chamber of Commerce Government Relations Committee, the Monterey County Hospitality Association, Monterey County Business Council, and the Fort Ord Reuse Authority.

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Voters give a lift to transportation needs

More than \$150 billion were authorized by local transportation measures across the nation and voting patterns indicate that the country is not divided on this issue. Locally, voters passed Measure X on Nov. 8 in Monterey County.

Cities and counties comprised of widely diverse voters chose to tax themselves to repair roads and increase public transit.

For example, residents of Indianapolis, Ind., an economically struggling city, voted to increase their income taxes to improve the bus system. In Los Angeles, the iconic car-loving city, voters passed a ½-cent sales tax

for perpetuity. It passed by 70%. A post-election analysis of the voting, by the advocacy group Transportation for America, (<u>t4america.org</u> (<u>http://t4america.org</u>)) showed that transportation was not a partisan issue in the Nov. 8 election. Rural, urban and suburban people all want better transportation choices, and they want local control. The more specific and detailed the transportation measure was, the more likely it was to pass. Most of the measures that passed were finally successful after several failed attempts.

A good example of that was Monterey County's successful transportation Measure X, a sales tax increase of %-of-a-cent projected to raise \$600 million over the next 30 years, or \$20 million a year. Measure X passed with 67.3% of the vote, just slightly more than the two-thirds approval needed. Efforts to pass a county transportation measure had failed five times previously. It is amazing that all of the diverse cities and towns of our county supported this measure, and all five members of the county Board of Supervisors also approved it.

In addition to L.A. and Monterey County, local self-help transportation measures were passed in Merced, San Francisco, Santa Cruz and Stanislaus counties.

Nationwide, transportation measures address the need to repair crumbling roads and include public transit support and efforts to increase safety when people are walking or riding a bicycle. Drivers, pedestrians, bicyclists and public transit users are not separate groups of people. Every bus ride begins and ends with a walk, recreational bicyclists drive a car to lovely areas to ride their bikes. I took the train to Crater Lake and rented a car to explore the area. We all use different modes of transit at different times, and the voters indicated that the American people want choices in transportation.

Potter backs train service

Dave Potter, Monterey County Supervisor for District 5, was honored Monday at the Transportation Agency for Monterey County (TAMC) Rail Policy Commission meeting for his 22 years of advocacy for rail projects. Potter, who has represented District 5 since 1996, has worked to bridge the gap in passenger rail service in Monterey County. The Amtrak Surfliner passenger train ends in San Luis Obispo and the Capitol Corridor starts in San Jose, leaving Monterey County as a big hole in train service. "Of all my supervisorial duties and efforts" Potter said, "working for rail service has been the most fun." Pending TAMC Board approval, Potter will represent TAMC on the Coast Rail Coordinating Committee after he leaves elected office in January. The committee has the goal of improving passenger rail service between San Francisco and Los Angeles. The Coast Daylight is a joint Caltrans/Amtrak effort by the CRCC to extend the Amtrak Surfliner up to San Jose, which would close the Monterey County gap in rail service. "We are pleased that Dave Potter is willing to serve," Debbie Hale, director of TAMC said, "because he has so much experience and a wealth of knowledge

in passenger rail advocacy for our county."

After his meeting with President Barack Obama in the White House on Nov. 10, President-elect Donald Trump tweeted, "Just had a very open and successful presidential election. Now professional protesters, incited by the media, are protesting. Very unfair!" GOOD:

It's a great week – and season – for patrons of **Monterey-Salinas Transit**, including veterans. In sync with Veterans Day last week, MST awarded free annual bus passes to 12 deserving veterans. Meanwhile all sorts of other progress is taking place: RealTime bus arrivals are now live via Google Transit; a partnership with the **Monterey County Hospitality Association** allows for free GoPasses for hospitality employees; and reduced bus pass pricing from \$95/month to \$13/month is in place for those affected by the Holman Highway 68 roundabout project – anyone who lives or works in Big Sur, Carmel, Carmel Valley, parts of Monterey, Pacific Grove and Pebble Beach. BAD:

It's been another rough week for those waiting to hear whether they'll receive a business permit to operate medical cannabis businesses in the city of Salinas. In July, the city legalized medical marijuana dispensaries, delivery services, manufacturing plants and cultivators. City Council decided to give out just 12 cannabusiness permits, three for each type of business, and initially expected to select the candidates as early as October. City Attorney Chris Callihan said the review process was slowed down "to complete our due diligence." Then on Nov. 7, Callihan said there was a new cause for delay: a hold-up on the Live Scan process because of a change in the Department of Justice's processing system. Now, interviews with applicants to finalize the selection process have been pushed to 2017. (Good news softened the blow for some industry players Nov. 8 when California voters said yes to legalizing recreational marijuana.)

\$192,521 grant awarded to cut Salinas pedestrian deaths

The Monterey County Health Department will work with three elementary schools in Salinas to provide education in pedestrian and bicycle safety.

The California Office of Traffic Safety has awarded a \$192,521 grant to prevent pedestrians and bicyclist traffic collisions. The program is called Safe Travels Via Salinas and will focus on Fremont, Los Padres and Sherwood Elementary schools. Monterey County Health Department Disease Prevention coordinator Jessica Perez will be responsible for the implementation.

"A unique feature of the grant is having the children practice with a mock town brought to their school," the health department announcement says. "Students will work with pretend traffic situations, such as cars

backing up in driveways and distracted drivers, learning to recognize the problems and how to protect themselves."

The yearlong grant will start on Nov. 21, an appropriate date since Nov. 20 is World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic victims (worlddayofremembrance.org/). The grant aims to reduce pedestrian accidents in the Salinas. There were 55 pedestrians injured isions in 2015, and three of them died. SPD granted \$105,000 for crash prevention

The Salinas Police Department has been awarded \$105,000 by the OTS for crash prevention. "This grant will no doubt prevent death and injury in Salinas," said SPD Traffic Sgt. Gerry Ross. "This money provides us with the resources to keep working toward our goal of zero traffic deaths." Statewide, after falling to a 10-year low in 2010, the number of persons killed in collisions has climbed 17% in California with 3,176 killed in 2015, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Particularly alarming is the six-year rise in pedestrian and bicycle fatalities.

It is less than a month since the death of 17-year-old pedestrian Gabriela Beas, who was killed when motorcyclist ran a red light at high speed on North Main Street in Salinas. It feels right that these two grants are aimed at preventing such tragedies in the future.

Salinas pedestrian death rates high

Our police and our health department are taking the issue of pedestrian injuries and deaths seriously. As reported in this column on Oct. 28 (http://www.thecalifornian.com/story/news/2016/10/27/pedestrian-deaths-should-shock-us/92864672/ (/story/news/2016/10/27/pedestrian-deaths-should-shock-us/92864672/), the proportion of pedestrian deaths in Salinas is four times the national average, and twice the California average. "Over the last few years approximately half of the fatal traffic collisions in Salinas have involved pedestrians," Ross said. "We need to realize how dangerous it is to drive. If a two-ton machine strikes a person at even 20 to 25 mph, that person will more likely suffer serious injury or death."

The Health Department is concentrating on education, while the SPD plans to do both education and enforcement. "Years of research tell us that enforcement and education work best jointly," said OTS Director Rhonda Craft.

Improving our county's infrastructure with Measure X funds

The third E in preventing traffic collisions, (along with Education and Enforcement) is Engineering, which means building safer infrastructure. Our county has just successfully passed a self-help transportation sales tax (Measure X.) We can now set our priorities for safe transportation.

It is difficult for many people to attend the public meetings concerning transportation planning. To increase opportunities to contribute, the

Transportation Agency for Monterey County (TAMC) wants your ideas for pedestrian and bicycle improvements. Finance Update - December 2016

General Accounting/Accounts Payable

During the month of December, staff processed timely and accurate payments to

vendors, recorded appropriate revenues, and prepared monthly financial reporting and analysis. Staff worked with our external auditors, Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP, to complete our Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for FY2016.

Payroll

Routine changes and adjustments to payroll records were maintained along with filing of all federal, state, and retirement reports and payments on a timely basis. Payroll continued to provide hours and earnings reports upon request to MST departments

Grants

Staff participated in the California Air Resources Board workshop for Volkswagen's California Zero Emission Vehicle Investment Commitment and began coordinating several proposals to submit to Volkswagen for consideration. Staff also attended the Monterey County community Development Block Group (CDBG) annual workshop. The FTA Triennial Review was officially closed out in December.

Purchasing

During the month of December, Parts staff was busy with managing inventory levels, and ensuring continued supplies. Inventory levels are remaining under \$200K. Parts staff has also been evaluating obsolete parts and equipment in anticipation of our relocation to a temporary facility during the construction of the new operations and maintenance building at Ryan Ranch Road. The temporary Parts room will be smaller; therefore, some inventory will be relocated to the parts room at CJW.

<u>Information Technology Update – December 2016</u>

Staff worked with MST Operations and Maintenance Department personnel for the monitoring of the ITS equipment installed on the vehicles. These include the hardware and software for the Trapeze Group Automatic Vehicle Location system on the fixed route and Paratransit fleets.

Staff liaised with Trapeze Software Group to continue the process for implementation of the Fixed Route Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system. Staff monitored the Real-time bus arrival system data. Staff monitored the Trapeze Group Enterprise Asset Management (EAM) vehicle maintenance system. Staff continued to support the users of the Serenic Navision accounting/payroll system. Staff monitored the functionality of the customer service database.

Staff worked with Giro and MST staff in the next phase of the implementation of the additional modules in the Hastus system. Staff liaised with the County of Monterey Information Technology Department and Trapeze Group regarding the radio hardware to be installed to extend data/radio/cell coverage to include San Jose and other outlying areas of service. Staff monitored the virtual computer systems. Staff monitored and configured the AT&T managed Voice Over IP (VOIP) telephone system. And, staff continued to support other MST staff members as needed, proactively ensuring that all were supported fully with their IT needs.

Planning Update - December 2016

During the month of December, staff continued to monitor the revenues and expenses for the military partnerships after implementation of the July 2014 Presidio reductions that were required because Congress allowed the expanded federal transit benefit to be reduced by nearly 50% effective December 2013. Revenues received from the federal transit benefit have stabilized and increased during recent months so that revenues are matching expenses and have fully made up for previous losses. During the month the

Presidio, with assistance of MST Business Development Transit Planner, Mike Gallant, continued its targeted recruitment efforts to maximize military and civilian participation in the federal transit benefit program. This effort is intended to stabilize and grow revenues for MST to continue operating the military-funded routes. Fortunately, Congress voted in December 2015 to raise the transit benefit again on a permanent basis. The benefit was raised for the Presidio participants on March 10, 2016. As such, staff will continue discussions with the Presidio to re-evaluate the program with some expansions possible for the future.

In December, staff began a bi-weekly check in with the consultant for the Bus Operations on Highway 1 Shoulders and the Monterey Branch Line Feasibility Study. Staff met with CSUMB to discuss transit items on campus. CSUMB hired a new transportation planner who will be coordinating with MST on planned transit service. Staff attended a State Parks meeting to discuss transportation issues along Highway 1 in the Carmel and Point Lobos corridor. State Parks is preparing a Master Plan for State-owned lands in the area south and east of Carmel.

Throughout the month, staff continued participating in meetings with various local agencies, including the Transportation Agency for Monterey County, Association of Monterey Bay Area Governments, the Monterey County Hospitality Association, Monterey County Business Council, and the Fort Ord Reuse Authority.

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



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

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Fraudulent Charges for Refunds Alert

It has been reported that at least one local Inn has been receiving "fake" reservations from identity thieves attempting to retrieve funds from stolen credit cards. How the scam works...

The scammers have been emailing the Inn directly to secure a reservation. The scammers are providing all of the necessary information, including a credit card, for the deposit. Once the reservation has been secured, the scammers email or call the Inn with an elaborate story about needing to cancel the reservation and have the deposit refunded. The catch is that the scammers say they need the refund submitted to a new card or by check as the original card has been lost and deactivated. This is how they are attempting to move money from one account to another.

To-date, none of the possible "fake" reservations came through an online booking system. They have all been via personal email.

remove the wooden forms. This week, **December 19** -**December 23**, crews will continue working on the earth work,
electrical work, and drainage work. Work will continue to be
behind the concrete barriers and off the road way, and no
daytime or nighttime closures are planned for next week.

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Seeing Salinas through holiday lights

It isn't every day that residents get to see their city council members decked out in Santa hats and singing "Jingle Belis" karaoke style, but on Sunday they had their chance at the annual Holiday Home Lighting Tour. The marathon four-hour event is a contest where residents vote for the best lit homes.

This year's tour covered a whopping 66 homes in the city's six districts and included a pit stop for sweets and caroling at Villa Serra and Northridge Mall.

Organizers led by city council members and city staff opened the holiday home lighting contest to all residents. Contestants are judged on the tour by attendees armed with voting slips. Awards include the offbeat "Griswold Award/over the top," and a special prize for the most energy efficient house.

Winners receive a cash prize, a yard sign and a certificate of recognition at the Salinas City Council meeting on Jan. 10.

"Many of them keep their lights up long after Christmas," said Councilman Steve McShane, who has watched the event grow exponentially since he founded it in 2010.

The free event (first come, first served) was quickly booked after reservations opened in early December. The sixth annual tour attracted 170 people – the largest number of attendees since its inception, with as many as 200 people on the waiting list, according to Ana Ambriz, the neighborhood services coordinator for the city of Salinas. There were a total of three buses this year compared to two last year.

The event was co-organized by city councilmembers and the city of Salinas, and sponsored by Monterey-Salinas Transit and PG&E.

On Sunday evening attendees, including families with young children, braved the cold and packed three luxury coach buses at the Kmart parking lot. They were treated to hot cocoa served by Councilman Tony Barrera, and greeted by fellow councilmembers who were decked out in festive suits, sweaters and other festive bling.

The atmosphere was festive with council members leading the bus in singing holiday songs. Council members also passed out burritos from La Plaza Bakery and holiday cookies.

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

Throughout the tour, attendees oohed and ahhed at the glittering house lights or the yard displays. 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

Best and worst of transportation 2016

The best news of 2016 is that a county transportation sales tax (Measure X) finally passed on the fifth attempt, providing local money for local needs,

The worst news of the year is the traffic collision percentage of pedestrian deaths in Salinas continues to be four times the national average.

I am happy to report that construction projects to make the roads safer for pedestrians has started in Greenfield, and is planned for east Sailnas and Castroville. I am sad to report that the free bicycle safety education trainings that were offered by the Transportation Agency for Monterey County (TAMC) were almost all cancelled due to lack of enrollment.

The good news of 2016: the 4th open streets event, Ciclovia Salinas, was a big success and Monterey-Salinas Transit (MST) has increased bus service to south Monterey county.

In this column I try to cover travel on buses and trains as well as active transit such as walking and bicycling. In 2016 I did the most columns about bus service, followed by pedestrian safety. Many of the pedestrian safety issues, such as traffic calming, include bicycle safety. I wrote five columns about using the train to take a vacation or even visit a doctor at Stanford. Some readers have told me that they are planning a train trip due to this column.

Follow the money

Many of my 2016 columns were about how to finance transportation: California Cap and Trade funding for projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions, the proposed Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT) as a replacement for the gas tax, grants for local projects and the need for Measure X were some of the topics.

Local advocates honored

Several columns honored Salinas residents: Mary Ann Worden of the Salinas Traffic and Transportation Commission; Isidro Cerda, land use planner for Building Healthy Communities; and Jim Hage, a local train advocate.

I did several columns about parking: misuse of handicap placards, the loss of residential parking to abandoned vehicles, and how a small business owner gets short-term parking spaces.

- 4. Develop strategy for replacement/expansion of Salinas maintenance facility Jun 2017 Status: Ongoing with staff working realtor to identify suitable alternatives.
- Conduct Board Strategic Planning Workshop. Jan 2017
 Status: Board Workshop conducted on January 9, 2017 with final strategic plan scheduled for adoption at meeting March 6, 2017
- 6. Secure grants to fund south county maintenance facility project including environmental documentation, design, permitting, property acquisition, and construction. - 2. Develop and implement service levels, facilities, polices, and procedures appropriate to funding availability and community requirements. Status: Due to inability to attract sufficient numbers of applicants some planned service expansion has been delayed.
- Actively participate in state and national trade association to support issues of local concern. Status: MST staff continues to actively participate in all state and national trade associations.
- 4. Continue employee training and development opportunities through partnerships with local colleges, universities, and vendors. Status: MST recently received a federal grant that supports training activities in local colleges and was successful in engaging Hartnell College to continue its participation in a regional transit training consortium.
- 5. Provide administrative support in service to Monterey County RTA. Status: Ongoing. Staff continues to support the RTA and has held board meetings and a strategic planning session during the year to date.
- 6. Ensure compliance with federal, state and local regulations and conduct regular review of policies and practices. **Status: Ongoing. This past month staff** received the close-out of its federal triennial review.
- 7. Maintain adequate staffing and organizational structure for MST and RTA.
